COMPREHENSIVE REPORT ON THE WEBINAR

A two-day national webinar on *Intellectual Property Rights (IPRs) & IP Management for Start Up* jointly organized by the National Institute of Technology (NIT), Arunachal Pradesh and Saint Claret College, Ziro (SCCZ) was held on March 05-06, 2021. The webinar was led by four resource personnel: Sri. Sanjay Bhattacharya, Deputy Controller & Head of Office, Patent Office, Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade, Kolkata, Ministry of Commerce & Industry, Government of India; Mr. Achintya Kumar Baruah, Retd. Senior Faculty, Indian Institute of Entrepreneurship, Guwahati; Sri. Siddharatha Devnath, Senior Scientist, Patent Information Centre, Assam, Department of Science & Technology, Government of India; and Dr. Mahua Hom Choudhury, Senior Scientist, Patent Information Centre, West Bengal State Science & Technology Council, Government of India. The workshop was attended by 56 participants.

Rationale:

In the late nineteenth century, new inventions various fields were increasing rapidly and the inventors became interested that those new inventions should not be infringed by anyone else through copying or by adopting the methods used by them. Intellectual Property (IP) refers to creations of the mind such as music, art, technological inventions, etc. Intellectual Property Rights (IPRs) and genuine ownership are the best ways to reform educational sector in the emerging economic situation. Due to lack of awareness on the benefits on rights protection, a major portion of students, scholars, teachers, and researchers had minimal ideas about monetary benefits of accruing an IP right and commercialization of their products. Additionally, the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) encourages higher institutions to promote innovation, research, and development beyond academics which includes IPR and patents (published or granted), and ranks by taking these accounts accordingly. IPR not only provide protection but also provides other benefits such as licensing, collaboration, funding opportunities, and a field for commercialization of the products. In today's global economic situation, a key survival strategy is to face global competition with knowledge, technology, and innovation. This webinar— jointly organized by the National Institute of Technology (NIT), Arunachal Pradesh and Saint Claret College, Ziro (SCCZ)—aims to bring awareness about the importance of having IPRs related to patent, trademark, trade secrets, etc. Various sessions will give insights on the revenue sharing of any IP generated from partnership between institution and external and internal partners.

Resource Personnel:

The webinar was led by four qualified personnel with rich experience:

1. Sri. Sanjay Bhattacharya, Deputy Controller & Head of Office, Patent Office, Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade, Kolkata, Ministry of Commerce & Industry, Government of India delivered and handled his session on Progress of IPR in India.
2. Mr. Achintya Kumar Baruah, is a retired senior faculty from the Indian Institute of Entrepreneurship, Guwahati. He delivered his lecture on Entrepreneurship as a Career and Self-Entrepreneurship Motivation.
3. Sri. Siddharatha Devnath, is a senior scientist, Patent Information Centre, Assam, Department of Science & Technology, Government of India. He handled session on Trademarks, Patent, Ownership, etc.
4. Dr. Mahua Hom Choudhury, Senior Scientist, Patent Information Centre, West Bengal State Science & Technology Council, Government of India delivered her talk on IPRs Innovation towards Shaping the Future: Prospect & Challenges.

Participants:

The webinar was participated by 56 (fifty-six) participants from eight different institutions of higher education. Over all, five states were presented: Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, West Bengal, Jharkhand, and Meghalaya. The list of participants is attached to this Dossier.

Webinar Sessions:

Both days were half day sessions (from 2:30 PM to 5:00 PM). There were a total of 04 sessions excluding the Inaugural and Valedictory programs. The sessions were centred on the theme of the webinar and spread across topics on Progress of IPR in India, Entrepreneurship, Trademarks, and IPRs Innovation. The sessions include lectures, talks, presentations, question & answer sessions. The detailed Schedule is attached to this Dossier.

Concluding Session:

The Webinar ended with a brief Valedictory Program. Four participants shared their experiences of the webinar and thank the organisers for having conducted such program of high significance. Dr. Saikat Kumar Jana, IPR Cell, NIT, Arunachal Pradesh enriched participants through his presentation on “Development of Biomass Pellet from Agricultural Waste & Its Utilization”. Dr. Utpal Talukdar, Coordinator IQAC, Saint Claret College, in his concluding remarks, congratulated the participants for their active engagement in the webinar and thanked all the speakers for their availability. He urged both the organising institutions to continue with their collaboration through signed MoU, which will be of great benefits to faculty and students.

Evaluative Feedback of Participants:

The online feedback and evaluation from the participants points to the efficacy, relevance, and successful conduct of the webinar. Every evaluative parameter has an average rating from 3.60 (good) to 4.75 (excellent), on a 5-point scale. The highest ratings (4.75) were given to “relevance of the theme of the webinar”, closely followed by the “question-answer sessions” (4.34) and “overall organization of the event” (4.20). The “quality of presentations”, and “relevance of topics” were rated at 4.10, and 3.60 respectively. On average, the conduct of the workshop was rated at 4.20 (*Very Good*).

Webinar on IPR for start-ups held

ITANAGAR, Mar 07: A webinar entitled 'Intellectual property rights and IP management for start ups' was organised by National Institute of Technology, Arunachal Pradesh and Saint Claret College, Ziro on March 5-6.

Patent issues in India and to be specific in Arunachal Pradesh were discussed in the webinar.

A few innovations from Arunachal Pradesh which had been successfully patented were also cited as examples and discussed to encourage the students.

About 60 students attended both the sessions and they were given E-certificate for attending the sessions.

The IPR cell of National Institute of Technology, Arunachal Pradesh has published 34 patents and hopes to publish more pat-



ents in the near future. After this successful webinar students were motivated towards innovation and IPR.

On the first day, Sanjay Bhattacharyya, the deputy controller and head of the patent office and A K Baruah, former senior faculty of the Indian Institute of Entrepreneurship spoke on the importance of acquiring patents.

The next day Siddhartha Debnath, scientist C from Patent Information Centre,

Assam and Dr Mahua Hom Choudhury, scientist C, Patent Information Centre, West Bengal state S&T Council registered patent agent, government of India addressed the participants and provided insights on how a patent could protect a start-up and its products from being copied and marketed by others without any rights on the technology.

The event was an outcome of an MoU between both the institutes.

The event was coordinated by Dr. Saikat Kumar Jana, IPR cell coordinator of National Institute of Technology, Arunachal Pradesh and Dr Bahaboklang Sohkhlet, Research promotion cell coordinator of Saint Claret College, and was supported by Dr Pinakeshwar Mahanta, Director of National Institute of Technology, and Dr Alwin Mendoz, Principal of Saint Claret College.

Many professors from both the institutes were present to make the event a success.

Dr. Prases Kumar Mohanty, Dean R&D of National Institute of Technology, Dr Sahadev Roy, the chairperson of IPR Cell, National Institute of Technology, Dr. S N Deepa from National Institute of Technology, participated in the webinar.

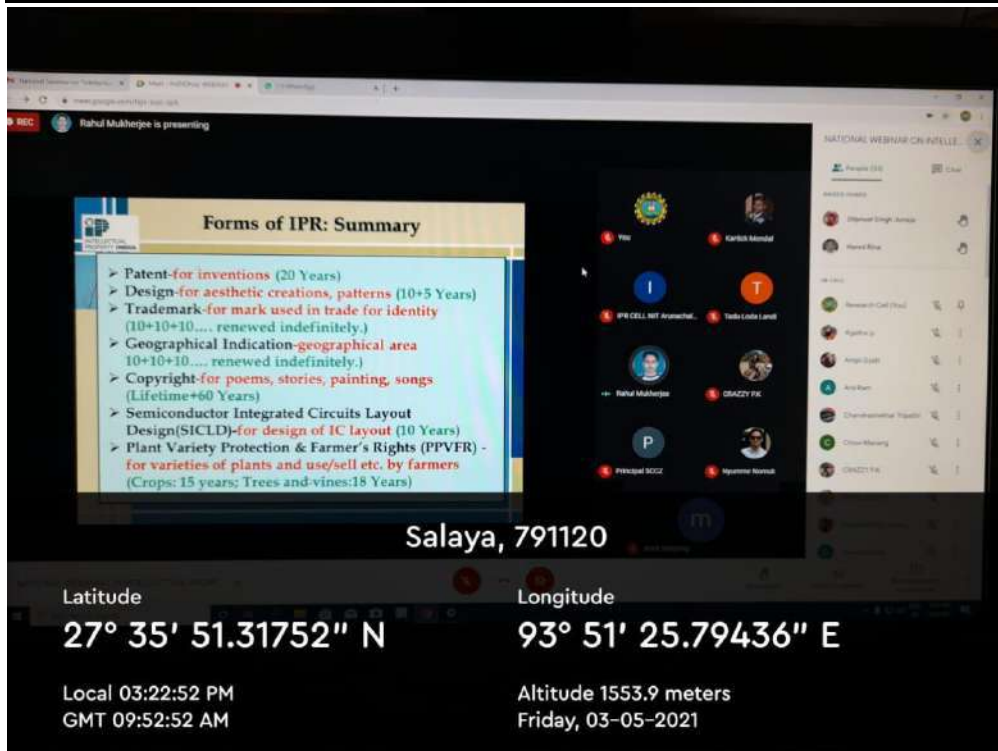
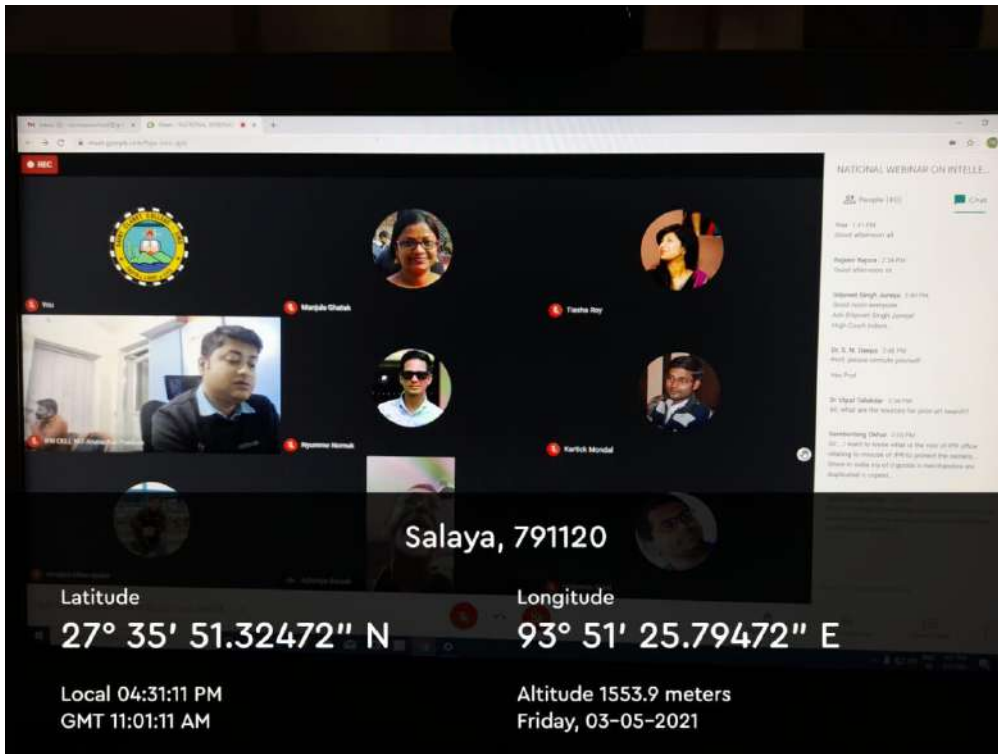
vation towards shaping the future," the college said.
